

Biography Julia Kuhn

German violinist Julia Kuhn has appeared as leader and soloist with the Orchestra of the Age of Enlightenment (OAE), The English Concert, Irish Baroque Orchestra, The Hanover Band, Orquestra Barroca Casa da Música Porto, The Mozartists and Opera Settecento. She is principal 2nd violin with the Academy of Ancient Music, guest principal 2nd violin for Austrian chamber orchestra Camerata Salzburg and is a core member of the Orchestra of the Age of Enlightenment.

Kuhn is artistic director for the St Blasius Early Music Summer Concert Series in Kaufbeuren, Germany. She will be the OAE's Night Shift concert series curator for the 23/24 season.

Kuhn is an Associate of the Royal Academy of Music London (ARAM), an award given to former students who contribute significantly to the music profession.

Future projects include further engagements as concert master with the OAE, the Irish Baroque Orchestra, The Mozartists, as well as soloist and leader for The Hanover Band.

Kuhn has taught masterclasses and workshops on both modern and baroque violin at Oberlin College, USA, The University of Chichester, UK, and the Kaufbeuren Music School, Germany, among others, and was guest leader for the Royal Academy of Music Baroque Orchestra, London. She gave lecture recitals in Youngstown University, USA, for the 39th Oficina de Música de Curitiba, Brazil (online), and was a tutor for The English Concert's worldwide online masterclass "One-to-one Session" project. She regularly takes part in the Orchestra of the Age of Enlightenment's education and outreach projects, often as ensemble leader. Kuhn was adjudicator for the 2022 Mica Comberti Prize competition for the performance of works by J.S. Bach at the Royal Academy of Music, London.

Kuhn was Teaching Assistant for the violin studio of the music faculty at Stony Brook University, USA.

As a private teacher Kuhn works with both modern and baroque violin and viola students. Her experience and knowledge of historically informed performance practice spans from the 17th to the early 20th century, she also teaches standard violin and chamber music repertoire and researches the music of politically ostracized composers of the 20th century.

Kuhn holds an MA with distinction in baroque violin from the Royal Academy of Music, London, and a BA with distinction in Violin Performance from the Mozarteum University, Salzburg. Further, she studied violin at Stony Brook University, USA, with a focus on research of the music of politically persecuted composers of the 20th century. Her teachers included, among others, Simon Standage, Prof. Harald Herzl and Prof. Philip Setzer (Emerson String Quartet).
